Confined Space Entry Check

Most confined-space deaths are would-be rescuers. Nothing on this sheet is optional, and the order matters.

1. Before the plane is broken

☐ Space identified: permit-required / non-permit. ☐ Permit completed and signed by the entry supervisor. ☐ Isolation done: lines blanked, energy locked out, agitators stopped. ☐ Entrants, attendant and supervisor named and briefed.

2. Atmosphere, in this order

☐ Meter bump-tested and zeroed in fresh air today. ☐ 1) Oxygen 19.5–23.5%. ☐ 2) Flammables below 10% LEL. ☐ 3) Toxics below the PEL. Order matters: combustible sensors need oxygen to read correctly, so an oxygen-deficient space gives a false low on flammables.

3. While the work goes on

☐ Continuous monitoring where conditions can change. ☐ Ventilation running and not recirculating exhaust. ☐ Attendant stays outside, keeps count of who is in, and has no second job.

4. Rescue

☐ Retrieval line and mechanical device rigged where the space allows. ☐ Rescue service confirmed available for today — not a phone number nobody called. ☐ The attendant never enters: non-entry retrieval from outside, and call the rescue team.

5. Stop conditions

☐ Any alarm, any change in the atmosphere, any entrant who sounds different: everyone out, then re-test. Re-entry needs a new evaluation, not an opinion.

Before you sign:

- Who is the attendant, and what is their only job?
- Who is coming if we need a rescue, and how long do they take?
- What does the meter read right now?
